Our family is the second owner of this 1942 Packard Pollson Town car. The original owner was the son of T.B. Walker. T.B. Walker was a successful Minneapolis businessman who made his fortune in timber and was the founder of the Walker Art Center in Minneapolis.

1942 was the last year of the custom coachwork-built Packards. This car is in nearly original condition and has only 24,000 original miles.
